Scoil Mhuire Naofa Uniform Policy

1. The School Uniform Policy is an integral part of the Behaviour Policy adopted in Scoil Mhuire Naofa which is signed by every parent/guardian. 2. Parents are asked to make every reasonable effort to ensure that their child is equipped with the correct school uniform. 3. Parents are asked to make every reasonable effort to ensure that their child maintains a high standard of uniform dress.

Rationale for School Uniform

1. A school uniform reflects a sense of belonging to a school community and therefore it is our aim that each pupil would take pride in their appearance in full school uniform.
2. Parents and visitors to the school agree that children look smart and neat in their school uniform.
3. School uniform is about Equality- all pupils are equal and as such are valued equally and treated equally.
4. Parents find school uniforms economical.
5. School uniform removes the peer pressure to wear designer labels and other expensive clothing and removes the pressure to keep up with fashion trends.
6. School uniform enables our pupils to take pride in their school and to have a sense of belonging.
7. A school uniform supports positive behaviour.
8. A school uniform helps create a school identity and allows children to be easily identifiable outside of school grounds
9. A school uniform establishes a code of dress appropriate to the image Scoil Mhuire Naofa wishes to present.
10. A school uniform reinforces a pride of appearance among the pupils in the school.
11. The wearing of uniform indicates acceptance of shared goals and support for the values Scoil Mhuire Naofa seeks to achieve.
12. A common uniform means less distraction from learning in the classroom.

All pupils: Grey Skirt/Pinafore/Pants Grey blouse/shirt & maroon tie. School Jumper
Appropriate footwear, suitable for all school activities (preferably black) No high heeled shoes allowed. Velcro shoes are recommended until pupils are able to tie their own laces.

P.E. Uniform for Pupils: School Tracksuit White Polo Shirt. Runners for P.E. and Indoor games The tracksuit is not an acceptable uniform everyday. Outside of PE days it may only be worn in the event of an emergency or on days /events specified by the teacher. A note is required if a tracksuit is being worn on non tracksuit days.

Hair

All students are expected to keep their hair in a neat and clean condition. Long hair must be tied back and out of the children's eyes and off their faces. Inappropriate hair dye, and styles including inappropriate patterns shaved into the hair are not permitted.

Jewellery

For safety reasons, the only jewellery that may be worn is one pair of earrings and a watch (no smart watches). Stud-type earrings are the only ones allowed to be worn in school and pupils are forbidden from wearing any facial-piercings at school. The wearing of make-up, false nails/eyelashes, fake tan tattoos etc is not allowed.

Labelling

Parents should ensure that all items are adequately labelled with their child's details. A laundry pen or formal label can be used for this purpose. Lost property: A lost property box is located in the School building. Pupils or parents must seek permission from the school secretary before searching the lost property box. Unclaimed lost property is sent to charity shops at the end of the school year. Teachers will not accept responsibility for lost items of clothing Dress and Appearance –

Implementation and Sanctions

Staff members will check uniforms as part of the daily school routine. Students are expected to wear their full school uniform every day without modification. If the dress code is not adhered to an explanatory note will be required.

Children with sensory needs will be dealt with on a case by case basis. Students will be asked to remove jewellery that is unsafe. The school tracksuit and runners are to be worn on P.E day. The uniform is designed so that parents can avail of generic items such as skirts, Shirts, pants and tracksuit pants in the major stores and from the local suppliers. Pupils are expected to keep their uniform clean and tidy.
